He famously claimed that the Cornish Pasty was in fact invented in Devon in about 1460 which not only caused consternation in Cornwall, but was remarked upon as far away as China.

along a DVD about the Somerset and Dorset Railway. It turned out to be very interesting, telling the story of how the line developed, visiting many of the stations and telling of its decline after nationalisation when it came under the Western region and services were gradually withdrawn, till its final closure under Beeching. There was archive film, and also visits to the sites as they are now, with abandoned viaducts still standing but with their embankments gone so they cannot be used for anything. It seems that, after closure, the powers that be were determined to make it impossible ever to reopen it, which is sad as it leaves many towns with no railway connection and very poor public transport services.

member with crutches, but most parked in the car park. Unfortunately one member found the entrance to be rather narrow and damaged her car on the way in. Be warned if you intend to park there.




