November Meeting

At the November meeting we welcomed Dr. Todd Gray FRHistS, MBE, a well-known historical writer on many aspects of Devon's history. He is based at Exeter University, and as of 2007 was Honorary Research Fellow of the University, Chairman of the Devonshire Association, Friends of Devon's Archives (retired 2014), and President of the Family History Society.

He famously claimed that the Cornish Pasty was in fact invented in Devon in about 1460 which not only caused consternation in Cornwall, but was remarked upon as far away as China. Dr Gray relayed many facts about the history of various parts of the county and emphasized the importance of evidence based study in his pursuit of historical facts.


Our last meeting before Xmas had the theme of "Modes of transport".


